



HARRY WILHELM, JR., a very special member.

In Early September, our Post Commander, Michael NK Huntington, our 1st VC Bryan Cuz Ireland, Alison Wetzel Josiah, Doug Lawrence and I visited **Harry Wilhelm Jr.**, a Post member with <u>80 years of membership</u> with American Legion Post 116 in Reisterstown, MD.

Bryan, who is our Membership Chairman this year, noticed that Harry was celebrating his 80th year of continued membership with the Post and called him to see how he was doing and if the Post could do anything for him. This is called a "Buddy Check".

Harry told Bryan that it would be nice if someone from the Post would stop by sometime to visit with him as he lives alone. We asked Doug Lawrence to make up a special membership achievement award for Harry so that we could visit with him and present him this award.

Needless to say Harry was totally surprised when we all came to visit him at his home and present him this award. For a man who is 97 years old he is sharp as a tack and was able to tell us all kinds of interesting stories about his life and his achievements.

Harry was born in 1927 and was raised in the Pimlico area of Baltimore City. His family later moved to Baltimore County where he lived in the Chestnut Ridge area and attended Franklin High School. Harry was the only male student in his class to take secretarial courses at Franklin High School. After graduating from Franklin High School Harry applied for a secretarial job at C&P Telephone Co. but didn't get the job because secretarial jobs were always done by women.

In 1945 he turned 18 years old and was drafted into the Army. He was stationed at Indiantown Gap in Pennsylvania where he served as a clerk typist and performed other administrative jobs. At that time Indiantown Gap was used as a POW Camp for German soldiers and Harry was responsible for ordering and delivering food rations to the prisoners. As the war ended Harry was transferred to Ft. Lee in Virginia where he did his Basic Training. After Basic Training he was chosen to model new uniforms for the Army until he was Honorably Discharged after 2 years of service.

He was hired by Baltimore Gas & Electric Company as an office boy and slowly moved up to accounting while attending night school. He eventually became involved in obtaining land for sub stations and cross county power and transmission lines. He negotiated with land owners and worked with judges, politicians and government agencies to procure the land to build power plants, etc. He worked for BGE for 48 years and retired as a Supervisor with people working for him.

Harry has led an interesting life and as part of the greatest generation served his country and led by example. We are looking forward to honoring Harry in the near future at a Post event.

Thank you Harry for your 80 years of Membership in the American Legion and to Post 116. We salute you!
